**Note: A trip leader may turn you away for not having adequate equipment, but it's your responsibility to make sure you have it. A trip leader may also require that you bring additional equipment.**

<b>Minimum Equipment for All Club Trips</b>	<b>Highly Recommended for All Trips</b>
<p><b>PFD (approved life jacket)</b>  <b>Spray skirt</b>  <b>Flotation in both ends of boat (air bags or bulkheads)</b>  <b>Bailing device</b>  <b>Rain gear and hat</b>  <b>Warm change of clothes (polypro type preferred)</b>  <b>Fresh water</b>  <b>Basic outdoor items, incl. whistle, waterproof matches/lighter, flashlight, sunglasses and sunscreen, knife</b></p>	<p><b>Paddle leash</b>  <b>Paddle float for self rescue</b>  <b>Compass</b>  <b>Charts of area</b>  <b>First aid kit</b>  <b>Flares</b>  <b>Flashlight</b>  <b>Extra food</b>  <b>Tow line (50')</b></p>

<p><b>Recommended equipment for trip leaders includes all the above, plus:</b></p>	
<p><b>Watch</b>  <b>Current tables</b>  <b>Waterproof flashlight</b>  <b>Spare paddle</b>  <b>Flares</b>  <b>Weather radio</b>  <b>VHF radio, PLB, or SPOT locator</b></p>	<p><b>Rescue slings and tow rope</b>  <b>Repair kit: pliers, duct tape, screw driver, etc.</b>  <b>Sleeping bag in dry sack</b>  <b>Tarp or tent</b>  <b>Extra food</b></p>
